They believe falls are not a normal part of aging and are working tirelessly to prevent falls.

History

- Started Feb. 24, 2010
- Developed and maintain website <u>www.lacrossestopfalls.org</u>
- Designed, developed, distributed 4,000 **Falls Prevention Magnets** to all First Responders, Tri-State Ambulance drivers, and Fire and Police Depts.
- Distributed additional 4,000 Falls Prevention Magnets to older adults and caregivers in La Crosse County. Designed, developed, distributed 13,500 La Crosse County Falls Prevention Resource Guides to health care providers, community agencies, caregivers, emergency response providers, etc.
- Implemented **"Remembering When"** a Fire and Fall Prevention Program of the National Fire Protection Association
- Presented nearly 50 Stepping On classes to over 500 Seniors.
- Spoke to over 2,500 Seniors on falls prevention.
- Plan, promote, present annual Falls Prevention Awareness Day program.
- Help implement Tai-Chi Fundamental program in La Crosse County.

- Implement research project to evaluate the effectiveness of Stepping On

- Invent new falls prevention programs
